Vlooybergtoren

What's cooler than a floating staircase in the middle of the landscape? The Vlooyberg tower is 11 meters high and stands at one of the highest locations in the Hageland in Tielt-Winge. In the vicinity of the tower you will find many beautiful hiking trails.

Since the 14th century, the Maagdentoren has stood proudly beside the Demer river in Zichem (Scherpenheuvel). The tower is 26 metres high, with a diameter of 15 metres and walls over 4 metres thick. From the roof you have a unique view over the region.

The Wolfsputten is a 90-hectare nature reserve in Dilbeek, just outside Brussels. The Lookout Platform provides a stunning view of the Wolfsputten. In spring you will find a magnificent carpet of flowers and a wonderfully intense fragrance.
