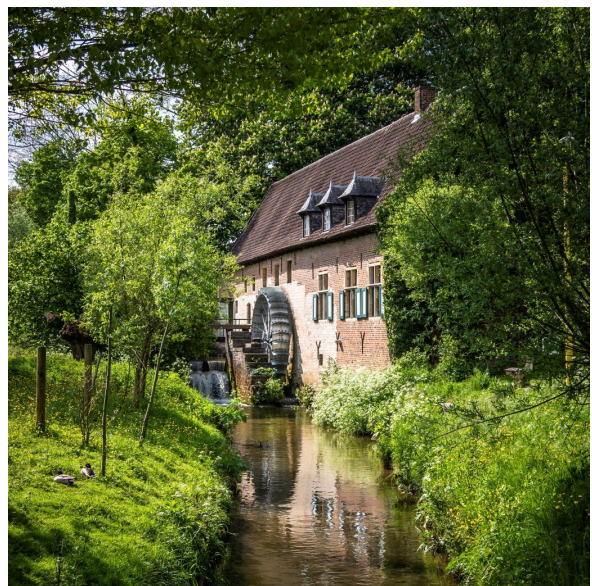
5. Climb the Vlooybergtoeren Tielt-Winge



The floating staircase is made of stainless COR-TEN steel, its colour reminiscent of its ironstone heritage. It stands at over 11 m high and is more than 20 m long. It's at the top of one of the Hageland's highest locations, an inlier around 80 m high, that you'll find this look-out staircase.

6. Visit the Museum of Old Technics

The MOT is a DIY museum of hand tools and techniques powered by man, wind or water. Located in three historical sites spread across Grimbergen, this museum is a quiet green spot at the brink of Brussels.
